## Webelos Resident Camp – *Basic Information*

### **Camp Theme:**

This year's theme is *Deep Blue Sea*. All current Bear and first-year Webelos den members are invited to join us this summer for Webelos Resident Camp. First year and second year Webelos Scouts will have their own program.

In addition to working on requirements for activity badges, there will be opportunities for Scouts to hone their skills with BBs and bow & arrow. They'll swim in the pool and use rowboats on the lake. They'll hike and sing and sleep in tents and work on knot tying. And yes, the slingshot range will be open again!

### **Location:**

Webelos Resident Camp is held at Beaumont Scout Reservation, which sits on over one thousand acres along the beautiful Grand River in Ashtabula County. The camp is located just seven miles south of I-90 at exit #223 (Route 45) near Rock Creek, Ohio. Camp is about one hour drive from downtown Cleveland.



### **Registering for Camp:**

You are strongly encouraged to register for camp as a den or pack. This enables you to share a campsite with other members of your Cub Scout pack. Discuss your den's/pack's plans with unit leaders and register as a den or pack!

Individual Cub Scout registrations are also accepted and will be grouped with other individual Cub Scouts into a provisional group. Please note that there is an additional cost when one or more Cub Scouts attend without sending along an adult leader.

Submit all Cub Scout and adult leader registration forms along with the Pack Registration Roster (enclosed) to the Council Service Center, with your total camp fee.

## Parent & Den/Pack Leadership Responsibilities

We would like to thank you for all that you will do before and during camp to ensure that the boys have a great time. Parents and pack leadership will share in one of the most unique experiences of their lives. *You are vital in the operation of Webelos Resident Camp!*

When camping as a den/pack, it is your Cub Scout pack's responsibility to provide adult leadership. The national policy for the Boy Scouts of America is two-deep leadership. If your pack is bringing more than 10 Webelos to camp your pack will need to provide an additional adult for every 5 Webelos (e.g. 1-10 Webelos = 2 adults; 11-15 Webelos = 3 adults, 16-20 Webelos = 4 adults) If your unit brings a den of 11-15 Webelos, one adult gets to attend camp for FREE! If your unit brings a den of 16-20, two adults get to attend camp for FREE!

## Campsite Reservations

Reserve one of the Broadbent campsites for your den or pack. If you have eight or more Scouts, have tents and other additional camping gear and would like to reserve a campsite, please note this information on the Pack Registration Roster.

## Provisional Group

Individual Webelos Cub Scout registrations are welcome. They will be grouped with other individual Cub Scouts into a provisional group. Depending on the number of these Scouts, two or more adult volunteers (registration fees waived) will be recruited to lead this provisional group. If this sounds interesting to you, please contact Program Director Jeffrey Gifford.

## Camp Orientation for Pack Leaders:

Orientation sessions for parents and pack leaders will be held on a number of dates in June (both evenings and weekends) at the Council Service Center. This is when parents and all adults attending Webelos Resident Camp can receive the latest information on the program plans. Information on the orientation will be mailed to registered leaders.

## Beaumont Trading Post:

The Greater Cleveland Council operates Beaumont, a trading post, in camp. A variety of things are offered for sale:

- camp T-shirts
- patches
- craft items
- camp souvenirs
- camp supplies
- flashlights
- sleeping bags
- cameras
- batteries
- candy
- snacks
- juice
- Slush Puppies
- nachos

Beaumont is open daily and closed during meals. Look for hours posted at the front door.

## Food Service:

Meals are served in the Augustus Training Center Dining Hall. Before meals, dens will have opportunities to raise and lower the flag, sing camp songs and participate in a time to give thanks.

Outdoor camping can create a powerful appetite in a Cub Scout (adults, too!) and we are committed to providing appropriately nutritious meals during your stay. There will be three meals a day for each full day of camp – your first meal for Webelos Resident Camp will be lunch. There will be an opportunity for your den/pack to prepare a foil dinner one evening in your campsite. **If you have campers with food allergies, religious or other special diet requirements, please send a written notice to the Council Service Center at least two weeks in advance of your arrival so that the cooks can be prepared to meet your needs.** For major concerns, please contact the camp director directly at (440) 563-3319.

All campers (adults and Scouts) are requested to wear their uniform to the evening meal. Hats are not permitted at any time in the dining hall.

## Health Forms:

All campers (both Webelos and adults) are required to have a completed Class 1 Personal Health and Medical Record form **with them when they arrive in camp**. **DO NOT** include your health form with registration!

A parent or guardian must sign all Cub Scouts' health and medical forms, and must be dated within a year prior to camp.

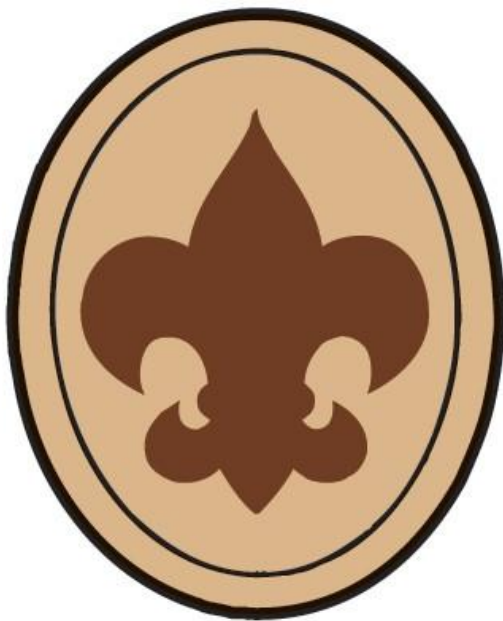

## Fees:

Webelos Resident Camp fee is \$95 per Scout, \$65 per adult. Early bird Scout registration is \$87 when registering and paying before May 31. Provisional Scouts, without accompanying parent or pack leadership, is \$125. T-shirt guaranteed only for paid registrations received by June 29.
