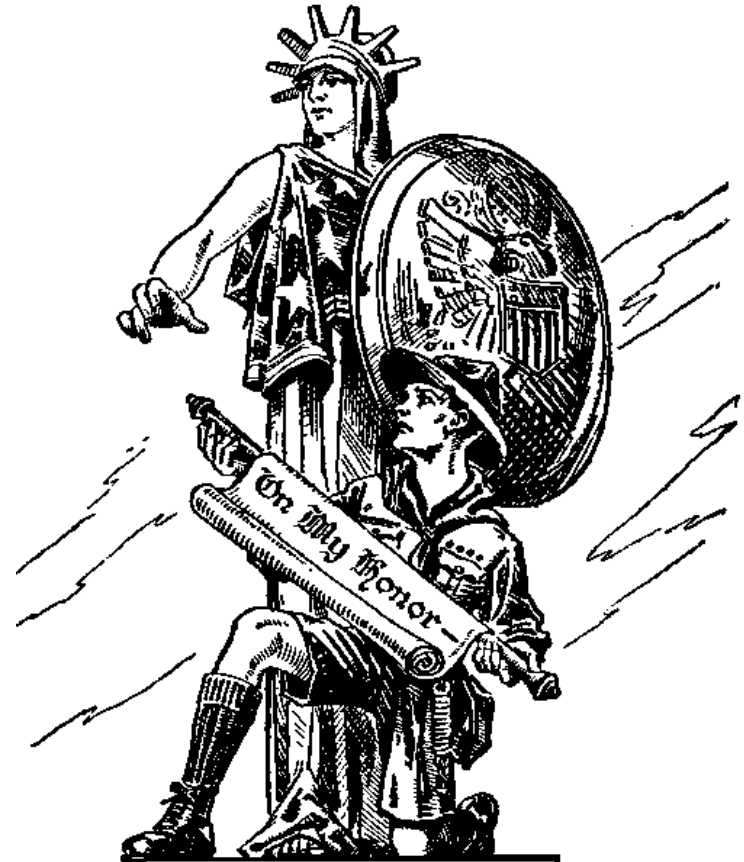

is to commemorate and preserve the history of the Boy Scouts of America and the Greater Cleveland Council through the operation of an archival institution. The facility features permanent and traveling educational exhibits and participates in local activities to promote public awareness of our colorful Scouting Heritage. The Dauby museum has assembled a comprehensive memorabilia collection chronicling the development of Scouting in Cleveland and around the world. The Museum is home to thousands of historical items including uniforms, hats, badges, patches, pins, flags, photographs, artwork and handbooks.

### **Dedicated to Nathan L. Dauby ...**

The Museum was opened on May 19, 1981. Mr. Dauby (1873-1964) was a local philanthropist and businessman who served as General manager of Cleveland's May Company Department Store and Director of the Louis D. Beaumont foundation and Dauby Charity Fund. It was through his efforts the Beaumont Scout Reservation was organized in 1945, honoring Louis D. Beaumont, a co-founder of May Company. The Dauby Museum was established with the support of the Dauby Foundation.

### **As a non-profit organization...**

The Dauby Museum operates under the auspices of the Greater Cleveland Council of the Boy Scouts of America. A volunteer Museum Committee, lead by a Curator and staff, oversee the various functions of the facility. They meet monthly to coordinate and plan Museum activities, prepare and display the collection and present an educational program for the general public and Scouting units, demonstrating Scouting skills.
